


Project Area



PRE-CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

Project Description:

The Flood Control District of Maricopa County (District) and the City of Phoenix (City) are undertaking a joint project for the design and construction of improvements to the 10th Street Wash between Alice Avenue and the Arizona Canal Diversion Channel (ACDC). The project consists of improving the existing wash to contain and convey 100-year storm event flows by replacing the wash with multiple barrels of pipe and box culverts. The project will also include landscaping improvements over the culverts and the construction of a multi-use path as shown in the proposed plan and rendering. When completed, approximately 84 homes will be removed from the floodplain. The project is approximately 3,000 feet in length and will cost approximately \$5 million.

Status of the Project:

The design plans for the project are complete. The construction is anticipated to begin within the next few months, subject to funding availability. In preparation for construction in the near future, some tasks such as utility relocations will be performed within the wash corridor. This will require the removal of some of the existing vegetation within the wash.

The landscaping and irrigation plan along with the multi-use path featured, has been designed by the City. The density and location of trees and shrubs may vary. The landscaping will consist of Native 24-inch box trees such as Blue Palo Verde, Desert Willow and Mesquite as well as 5 gallon shrubs and ocotillos. The plan will provide a native desert landscaped environment along the project corridor between the north and south bound lanes of 10th Street. The path will meander through the corridor providing a connection from the 10th Street Wash Basin and park on the north side of Alice Avenue to the ACDC multi-use path.
