




Broadway and Rural Drainage Master Plan

Introduction

The Broadway and Rural Drainage Master Plan (DMP) will identify existing flooding hazards and recommend strategies to mitigate these flooding hazards to protect public safety in a five-square-mile area within the City of Tempe. The study area boundaries are the Loop 101 Pima Freeway on the east, the Union Pacific Railroad spur just west of Mill Avenue on the west, the U.S. 60 Superstition Freeway on the south and the Union Pacific Railroad (just north of Broadway Road) on the north. The project is a partnership between the Flood Control District of Maricopa County and the City of Tempe.

Project Purpose

This project is being conducted to identify locations within the study area that are periodically subject to flooding caused by rainstorms. The project will develop strategies to reduce possible flood damage to existing structures. Preliminary analysis has indicated that certain portions of the study area are prone to periodic flooding and possible property damage during large rainstorms. Project Schedule

The project began in 2010 with a computer model analysis illustrating the effect of different rainstorm intensities on the residences, businesses, streets and drainage facilities in the study area. As additional analyses continue and the project team documents firsthand accounts of flooding from area residents and property owners, the project will develop alternatives to mitigate potential flooding caused by rainstorms. The alternative solutions are scheduled to be completed in late summer 2012.


